The most cutting-edge opera that is presently feasible Can vocaloids play opera?

Keiichiro Shibuya, who has been making waves with his activities as a musician and artist, and stage director/playwright/novelist Toshiki Okada, born like Shibuya in 1973, unveil the fruits of their first ever collaboration themed around "endings". "THE END" is an opera starring Hatsune Miku. While the basic traditional opera elements of tragic story, aria and recitativo have been adapted, no human singers or musicians perform in this first ever attempt at staging a vocaloid opera. This new YCAM production featuring multi-screen visuals laid over four sides of the stage, lighting and multi-channel sound, was created during the artists' residency at the Center, and aims to dissolve European style anthropocentrism that has come to be associated with the opera format, as well as such opposites as life/death, public/private, part/ whole, line/stratum, to explore the meanings of such things as "end" and "death".

The opera tells the story of Miku, who, after presaging her own destiny, embarks on quest for the "end" by way of a deteriorated copy of herself, and through dialogues with the other characters. Tragic variations unfurl in a space that connects to an endless valley, as Miku is destined to die. Or is she not?

Shohei Shigematsu

Architect. Born 1973 in Fukuoka. Partner of OMA and in charge of the architecture firm's New York office. Main works include the CCTV Headquarters in Beijing, Shenzhen Stock Exchange Headquarters, the Prada exhibition "Waist Down", an extension to the College of Architecture, Art and Planning at Cornell University, and the new building of the Musée national des beaux-arts du Québec. Next to collaborating with artists, designing Marine Abramovic's new performance space and Cai Guo-Qiang's NY studio/atelier among others, he presently works as a lecturer at The Harvard Graduate School of Design, and at Columbia University's Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation.

Pinocchio P

Composer. Made his debut with the contribution of "Hanauta" on February 23, 2009. Has been energetically posting original compositions since, while at once aggressively engaging also in collaborations and live broadcasts. In addition to his activities as a composer, he has been displaying his multifarious talent also as a creator of illustrations used in movies. His vocaloids are Hatsune Miku and Kagamine Rin. In July 2012, his first album on a major label, "Obscure Questions" was released on EXIT TUNES.

Masato Tsutsui

VJ, programmer. Has been pursuing universal qualities of video as a form of visual expression, by a pioneering approach that maximizes the benefits of technology. Has appeared as a VJ at such festivals as "METAMORPHOSE", "SonarSound Tokyo", "electraglide", "FUJI ROCK FESTIVAL", "BIG BEACH FESTIVAL" and others. Has been developing systems for real-time & interactive video in the realm of spatial choreography with a focus on advertising.

Further involved in the form of video production, character design and co-performance is YKBX (a.k.a. Masaki Yokobe), a video artist who has been attracting attention with his original visual world as exhibited in music videos among others. Stage art is by architect Shohei Shigematsu from the architectural office OMA New York, known for his work with the likes of Kanye West and Marina Abramovic. Leading sound artist evala is in charge of sound programming to wrap the audience in a veil of sound, while Pinocchio P, a highly popular creator of unique melodies and lyrics, took charge of the Vocaloid programming. Another member of the programming team is Masato Tsutsui, an omnipresent figure in the VJ scene.
