In their respective performances, Senyawa and Kakushin Nishihara aim to explore new creative possibilities combining state-of-the-art audio technology and traditional sounds. Senyawa is a duo of artists from Indonesia who have been creating experimental music inspired by musical and folkloric tradition, while Nishihara is known for her unique style juxtaposing the traditional sound of the Satsuma biwa with experimental noise music. Their concert is part of the Ars Electronica Festival, one of the world's largest media art events that has been annually held in Linz, Austria, with the involvement of YCAM. Look forward to a unique experience beyond the boundaries of space and time, brought to you wherever you are by a "cultural mixture" of musicians.

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Profile

SENYAWA

Yogyakarta's Senyawa embodies the aural elements of traditional Indonesian music while exploring the framework of experimental music practice, pushing the boundaries of both traditions. Senyawa's music strikes a perfect balance between their avant-garde influences and cultural heritage to create truly contemporary Indonesian new music. Their sound is comprised of Rully Shabara deft extended vocal techniques punctuating the frenetic sounds of instrument builder, Wukir Suryadi modern-primitive instrumentation. Amplified it fuses elements of traditional Indonesian instrumentation with garage guitar distortion.

Kakushin Nishihara

Kakushin Nishihara is a Satsuma-Biwa (Japanese traditional string instrument) player and a collage artist. She was born in Tokyo and started her music career from making a band and learning various musical instruments. At one time, she got amazed by a Satsuma-Biwa master, Kinshi Tsuruta, and got interested in the traditional device. Kakushin then trained under Satsuma Biwa master, Kinshi Tsuruta, until her teacher's passed away. She continues to study the instrument while starting to develop her music style, which ranges from classical biwa performances, experimental noise, and also collaborative music projects with other musicians and contemporary artists.
