A project has begun to strengthen YCAM as the Hub for Performing Arts

The Japan Art Council has established the Japan Creator Support Fund, which offers various support programs, including the Projects for Cultural Facilities as Hubs for nurturing young creators and artists with global potential. Since 2024, the Yamaguchi Center for Arts and Media [YCAM] has been part of 13 facilities that receive this support, working on "Where Theater Meets School", a talent development project through the creation of artworks where children and technology meet. This project aims to support creators involved in creating works and strengthen the cultural facilities' functions as hubs for sharing such activities.

This project aims to strengthen the capabilities of the YCAM stage production crew and its collaborators, including dancers and choreographers, who participate in the creation and presentation of performing arts at YCAM, by providing support for the research and training necessary for their work. YCAM will also present works created through this project to a more diverse audience, such as the local elementary schools participating in their art education programs, as well as overseas theaters.
